

#### **Land Acknowledgement**

The MCC is part of the C2 Centre for Craft located on Treaty 1 Territory, the traditional lands of the Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, and Dene Peoples and the homeland of the Métis Nation. Winnipeg's water source is Shoal Lake, home of Shoal Lake 40 First Nation and Iskatewizaagegan 39 **Independent First Nation.** As a provincial organization, MCC's activities support craft artists across Manitoba, connecting to folks living on Treaty 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 Territories and communities who are signatories to Treaties 6 and 10.

# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

With Covid having diminished enough to allow for in person attendance again, the Manitoba Craft Council was able to provide a full slate of exhibitions and programming at the C2 Centre for Craft and beyond.

Two group shows and a solo exhibition were enjoyed by numerous patrons along with an online exhibition by students and emerging artists. At least a dozen workshops along with artist talks and community outreach projects were also presented.

Crafted at the WAG was back for in person attendance and the MCC teamed up with IKEA for our first annual Vinterfest Craft sale at IKEA's Winnipeg store.

Ceramic artist Grace Nickel, nominated by the MCC, was awarded the Saidye Bronfman Governor General's prize for 2023. This award recognizes exceptional artists who have shaped their field of craft.


Due to the increasing scope of our programming and our growing membership, we have added ten staff hours to accommodate more community engagement activities, enabling us to achieve some of the goals we set out in our last strategic plan. Combined with the rising cost of everything and the frozen state of core funding, it was a deficit year for us. On a more positive note, the MCC board decided to invest some of its accumulated surplus into the creation of an endowment fund held by

the Winnipeg Foundation, the proceeds of which will flow into general operations each year.

Overall it was a busy and fulfilling year. Of course none of this happens without the diligence and hard work of the Manitoba Craft Council staff and volunteers. Their ability and good cheer help ensure the organization's ongoing success.

# MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

"What three words would you use to describe the Manitoba Craft Council?"
Our staff and stakeholders were recently asked this question as part of the organizational development work we're doing this year. The goal of the exercise was to check the alignment between what we strive for and the perceptions of our membership and audience. Are we on the same page? Yes! The word that came up most frequently, both from our leadership and our members, was "community."

As an organization, we talk about being "member-centered" - we love craftspeople, and we want to create social, cultural, and economic opportunities that will allow them to thrive in whatever way they wish. Full of inspiration, creativity and meaning, a career in craft can also be challenging in many ways, and it's often solitary. Not surprisingly then, "community" is one of the most often cited reasons people give for joining the MCC - the opportunity to connect with others, share ideas and skills, and find support. In person and online, we are seeking each other out.

Feedback from our IKEA Vinterfest market artists confirmed the trend when asked what they most appreciated about that event:

"My spectacular neighbours..."

"The great group of people and the friendly and supportive community feel amongst the vendors & Craft Council folks!" "The people! Love the Craft Council. Love the Ikea folks. Love the makers."

"The quality of all the people involved, Everyone was absolutely dedicated to what they were doing and in supporting each other to do their thing well. It did not feel competitive."

"The community!"

Recognizing the power and importance of relationships, over the past year the Manitoba Craft Council has continued to prioritize activities that **enlarge our circle**. We've worked with MCC member Sheila Cailleau to host her Warm Hands Warm Hearts workshops in which dozens of volunteers transform old fur and leather coats into handmade mittens for those experiencing homelessness in Winnipeg.

In partnership with our neighbours at MOSAIC Newcomer Family Resource Centre and artists Danielle Desrochers and Margaret Firlotte, over 100 EAL (English as Additional Language) learners have had the opportunity to explore Métis culture and complete a beaded brooch project. We were also thrilled to host the artists behind Women Helping Women Beadwork Collective for a holiday sale in our gallery two years in a row, helping create opportunity for women who are, or have been, incarcerated.

People are the heart of MCC, and it's the members, volunteers, board and staff who make this community possible. For all the hard work, love, and connectedness you offer the community through craft, I thank you!

September-October 2022: Eco-Craft paired Manitoba craft-based artists with scientists whose work connects to climate science. Through meetings and discussion, the artists developed a personal appreciation of the physical work (the how), motivating intentions (the why), and the connecting research practice (the leap of faith) each scientist maintains, and then returned to the studio to create or co-create artwork connected to that experience. The resulting exhibition invites us into complicated subjects via visceral and

tactile means to disarm us with humour, materials, and wonder.



- The flagship Crafted Sale returned to WAG-Qaumajuq with the launch of a new iniatiative, the Crafted Fashion Show.
- The first iteration of the MCC-IKEA Vinterfest Market took place in December 2022.
- MCC hosted a Holiday Trunk Sale with U of M Honours Fine Arts Students who use craft materials in their work.
- C2 hosted the non-profit Women Helping Women Beadwork Collective for a Trunk Sale in December 2022 which saw over 100 people come to shop beadwork made by incarcerated women in Manitoba, with 100% of the profits going to the makers.
- The C2 Shop continued to offer work by over 70 MB craft artists, both in-person and online and hosted another successful run of its annual Holiday Ornament Sale.






